

A Clinton and a Bush to speak at GBTA convention

It's a first lady double-header at the the Global Business Travel Association Convention in San Diego in August.

GBTA last week announced that former First Lady Laura Bush would be a luncheon speaker. Then it topped that yesterday by announcing that Hillary Clinton will be the keynote.

It's also a travel-industry double-header summer for Hillary Rodham Clinton, who will be keynote speaker at both the GBTA and the American Society of Travel Agents conventions. Mrs. Clinton is the former U.S. Secretary of State and senator from New York, and a continually-mentioned possible presidential candidate, though just today her husband asked the press to stop referring to her in that way.

GBTA executive director Michael W. McCormick noted that Clinton was the most traveled Secretary of State, visiting more than 112 countries "and in doing so, demonstrating the key role that travel plays in diplomacy, government, and business."

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
